This project is designed to teach 4-H members about Scrapbooking. The history of your life can be preserved for the next generation by creating a scrapbook filled with your collection of pictures and memorabilia. Memorabilia items to save include ticket stubs, business cards, greeting cards, awards, certificates, letters, postcards, recipes, receipts, and brochures.

Quick Tips

- Seniors are required to complete the Senior Project on page 32 of the manual. Seniors exhibiting the one-page layout for the fair will need to complete the Senior Project for a single page.
- Pages in the Scrapbooking album need to be numbered and labeled using small stickers in the lower right corner as to not cover up the page.
- Place the technique list on the inside front cover of the album, per manual (page 5), and label techniques per page as required.
- An album typically comes with either eight (8) pages or ten (10) pages to total sixteen (16) or twenty (20), front and back. To make it easier, make sure you create sixteen (16) separate layouts, which will ensure that you have sixteen (16) pages in your album.
- When creating your project, whether it's a single layout, two-page layout, or an entire album, it should be coordinated and follow a theme, or be in chronological order.
