ROBOTICS & ENGINEERING TIP SHEET

Robotic & Engineering Information:

The overall project name was changed to “Robotics & Engineering” to better reflect the fact that a few of the units (1 & 2) don’t really involve robotics, but instead are more engineering-focused.

- Junk Drawer Units 1-3 have remained mostly the same, just the names changed to include “engineering” --Robotics & Engineering Unit 1 -Give Robots A Hand; Robotics & Engineering Unit 2-Robots on the Move; Robotics & Engineering Unit 3 -Mechatronics
- The platform units (4-6) are also still there, but they have been renamed with “beginner”, “intermediate”, and “advanced” to better help members decide when they should advance to the next unit. If a child is working on a robotics platform (VEX, EV3, NXT) by themselves, this is the set of units they should enroll in. Youth are encouraged to move up units yearly or every other year as they gain more confidence and experience.
- All the team robotic units have been combined into the new unit 7 “Team Robotics” --this unit is for any youth on a youth robotics team (any platform). Youth who were in BEST, First, FRC or FTC should switch to this unit. Additionally, youth who were on a team but enrolled in the platform units in previous years are encouraged to switch to this unit.

Project Tips:

- The first three robotic units are for members who want to learn about and build robots.
- Unit 7 is for competitive teams --groups of 4-H members who want to learn how to build robots and compete
- Take part in at least two leadership experiences each year
- Be sure to include your e-record in secure binder with your exhibit
- If you plan to take the unit more than one year, make sure that your exhibit is different for each unit
- Enter your exhibit (s) in the county fair
- Share the information learned in talks and displays

Judging Criteria:

- Completeness of answers
- E-record includes demonstrations, talks, story, and pictures, with at least one action shot of the members doing something with their project.
- Neatness and legibility
- How you completed your activities and the quality of exhibit

Robotics Cheat Sheet:

- Robotics Platforms--just a fancy way to say robotic kits or robotics materials. Some types of commercial kits or platforms include: Arduio Kits, EV3, Brushbot, Make, Hexy, Pushbutton Programmable Robotic Kit, Sparky, Cubelets, Robotic Arm Edge, Sparkfun Red Bot, WeDo Multiplo, NXT, TETRIX, CEENBoT, and VEX
