Who are Cloverbuds?

4-H members who are five, six or seven by December 31 of the previous year.

What do Cloverbuds do? 4-H Cloverbuds programs are:

- activity-focused and not project-focused
- built on cooperative learning, rather than competitive activities
- varied to develop specific skills or concepts

4-H Cloverbuds members participate in occasional, non-competitive, sampler-type, age-appropriate, properly supervised events or activities sponsored or conducted by 4-H groups.



Why Cloverbuds?

The overall purpose of the 4-H Cloverbuds program is to foster the development of life skills that are essential for the cognitive, social, emotional and physical maturation of Kindergarten through 3rd graders by providing a unique educational opportunity.

4-H Cloverbuds

Program Components:

Cloverbuds may exhibit or showcase in a noncompetitive event or can feature items from their group activities. They do not participate in activities involving handling of animals. They are not eligible to receive premium funds as a result of exhibition. They may receive ribbons for participation, but not regular 4-H ribbons.



Additional Info:

Cloverbud age youth and younger are not allowed to participate in any 4-H Shooting Sports activity which include rifle, pistol, shotgun, archery, muzzleloader, western heritage, or hunting disciplines.

Cloverbuds do not conduct formal business meetings or elect officers. They do have structured routines.
