Matting Photos Guidelines:

- For county and state fair display:
 - The photo must be 5" x 7" in size
 - The photo must use a photo technique you are using within your unit
 - The maximum size for the matted photo will be 8" x 10"
- Photos will be hung for display. Attach a string or hanging mechanism for the photo to hang. Please do not put the photo in a frame.
- Please attach to the back of your photo the following information:
 - Member name
 - Member county
 - Subject
 - Date photo was taken
 - Notes

Judging Criteria:

- Unit 5
 - Completed e-Record
 - Labeled photo journal/binder with at least 20 4"x6" prints taken while doing the project
 - Three 5" X 7" photos, no larger than 8" X 10" matted
 - Back of print should be labeled:
 - Camera used, Exposure details, Photo #, Activity from the manual, Date photo taken
 - Project evaluated on quality of e-Record (25%) and exhibit (75%)
- Unit 6
 - Completed e-Record
 - Labeled photo journal/binder showing progress and achievements
 - Display photo 5" X 7", no larger than 8"X 10" matted
 - Project evaluated on quality of e-Record (50%) and Exhibit (50%)

Judging Criteria:

- Units 1-4
 - Completed e-Record
 - Completed Photo Journal/Binder with photos labeled:
 - Camera used
 - Activity #
 - Photo # (left to right and top to bottom)
 - Subject
 - Date photo was taken
 - Best Photo-matted and ready to hang
 - Project evaluated on quality of e-Record (25%) and exhibit (75%)
 - Each unit has its own specific activities that need to be included in the exhibit
