Basic Handling A. Display confidence, safety and knowledge while working around the horse.	Maxilliulli	
B. Fitting and turnout of the horse should be show ring quality, or rider may explain appropriate show ring turnout.		
Riding A. Horse/rider demonstrate gaits and frame associated with a USEF/USDF Second Level dressage test i.e. gaits (freedom and regularity), impulsion (desire to move forward, elasticity of the steps, suppleness of the back, engagement of the hindquarters), and submission (attention and confidence, harmony, lightness and ease of movements, acceptance of the bridle, lightness of the forehand).		
B. On the centerline, demonstrate collected trot (sitting), halt, salute, proceed collected trot (sitting).		
C. Show leg yield to right and left at the working trot (sitting).*		
D. Demonstrate collected and medium trot (both sitting); collected and medium canter.		
E. Demonstrate medium walk to free walk to medium walk.		
F. Perform a 10-meter circle (approximately 33 feet diameter) both directions at collected trot (sitting) and collected canter.		
G. At the collected canter, demonstrate a serpentine of three equal loops, width of arena, with no change of lead. Begin serpentine on correct lead.		
H. Perform shoulder-in left and right at the collected trot (sitting) on the long side of the arena. May start from a circle.		
I. At rising trot, ride 20 meter circles in both directions, gradually letting horse take reins out of hand then gradually taking up the reins.*		
J. From a collected trot (sitting), halt, rein back four steps, proceed medium walk.		
K. Ride collected canter across the diagonal. Half way across, perform a simple lead change through the walk: collected canter, collected walk, strike off on new lead collected canter.
