4-H Dog Rally Class Placement*

For 2021 ONLY, exhibitors who were in their first 4-H dog year in 2020 may remain as first year exhibitors for 2021 OR may choose to move up to the higher class

Novice Division	Rally Novice A	This class is open only to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally training*	<p style="text-align: center;">Exhibitor and dog team can only stay in this class for 1 year.</p> <p>Once a qualifying score is received at County Level¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials or the dog being shown has received an equivalent title from a national dog association*the member MUST move to Rally Intermediate A class or higher Division to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials.</p> <p>If the team does not earn a qualifying score at County Level¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials, the team MUST move to Rally Novice B to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials.</p>
	Rally Novice B	This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or more years in Rally Novice training and no qualifying score in Rally Novice A, OR an experienced handler starting a new dog*.	Exhibitor and dog team can stay in this class until receiving a qualifying score at County Level ¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials or the dog being shown has received an equivalent title from a national dog association*, then the exhibitor and dog team MUST move to Rally Intermediate A class or higher Division.
Intermediate Division	Rally Intermediate A	This class is open only to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally Intermediate training*.	<p>Exhibitor and dog team can only stay in this class for 1 year. Once a qualifying score is received at County Level¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials or the dog being shown has received an equivalent title from a national dog association* the member MUST move to Rally Advanced A class or higher Division to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials.</p> <p>If the team does not earn a qualifying score at County Level¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials, the team MUST move to Rally Intermediate B to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials.</p>
	Rally Intermediate B	This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or more years in Rally Intermediate training and no qualifying score in Rally Intermediate A*.	Exhibitor and dog team can stay in this class until receiving a qualifying score at County Level ¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials or the dog being shown has received an equivalent title from a national dog association*, then the exhibitor and dog team MUST move to Rally Advanced A class or higher Division to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials.

Advanced Division	Rally Advanced A	This class is open only to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally Advanced training*. Exhibitor and dog team must have completed Rally Intermediate training or approval of their County Dog Superintendents is required.	<p>Exhibitor and dog team can only stay in this class for 1 year. Once a qualifying score is received at County Level¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials or the dog being shown has received an equivalent title from a national dog association* the member MUST move to Rally Excellent A class or higher Division to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials.</p> <p>If the team does not earn a qualifying score at County Level¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials, the team MUST move to Rally Advanced B to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials.</p>
	Rally Advanced B	This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or more years in Rally Advanced training and no qualifying score in Rally Advanced A *. Exhibitor and dog team must have completed Rally Intermediate training or approval of their County Dog Superintendents is required.	Exhibitor and dog team can stay in this class until receiving a qualifying score at County Level ¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials or the dog being shown has received an equivalent title from a national dog association*, then the exhibitor and dog team MUST move to Rally Excellent A class or higher Division.
Excellent Division	Rally Excellent A	This class is open only to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally Excellent training*. Exhibitor and dog team must have completed Rally Advanced training or approval of their County Dog Superintendents is required.	<p>Exhibitor and dog team can only stay in this class for 1 year. Once a qualifying score is received at County Level¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials or the dog being shown has received an equivalent title from a national dog association* the member MUST move to Rally Advanced/Excellent A class or higher Division to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials.</p> <p>If the team does not earn a qualifying score at County Level¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials, the team MUST move to Rally Excellent B to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials.</p>
	Rally Excellent B	This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or more years in Rally Excellent training and no qualifying score in Rally Excellent A*.	Exhibitor and dog team can stay in this class until receiving a qualifying score at County Level ¹ or State 4-H Dog Trials or the dog being shown has received an equivalent title from a national dog association*, then the exhibitor and dog team MUST move to Rally Advanced/Excellent A class or higher Division.
Rally Advance/Excellent Division	Rally Advanced/ Excellence A (RAE-A)	This class is open only to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally Advanced/Excellent training*. Exhibitor and dog team must have completed Rally Excellent training or approval of their County Dog Superintendents is required.	Exhibitor and dog team can only stay in this class for 1 year. Once a qualifying score is received at County or State Fair in RAE A, Exhibitor and dog team MUST move to RAE B or Rally Masters to be eligible to compete in Rally at State 4-H Dog Trials in subsequent years.
	Rally Advanced/ Excellence B (RAE-B)	This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or more years in Rally Advanced/Excellent training.	Exhibitor and dog team may continue to compete in this class for the remainder of their 4-H years with the same dog regardless of whether a qualifying score is earned, or an equivalent title is received from a national dog association. Exhibitor and dog teams also have the option to move to Rally Master.

Division	Class Name	Class Registration Eligibility	Class Registration Progression
Master Division	Masters A	Optional class. This class is open only to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally Masters training. Exhibitor and dog team must have completed Rally Advanced/Excellent training or received approval from their County Dog Superintendent to enter this class.	Exhibitor and dog team can only stay in this class for 1 year. Once shown in Rally Masters, exhibitor and dog teams can no longer compete at any lower rally classes and MUST move to Masters B.
	Masters B	Optional class. This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or more years in Rally Masters training.	Once shown in Rally Masters, exhibitor and dog team can no longer compete at any lower-class rally classes. Exhibitor and dog team may continue to compete in this class for the remainder of their 4-H years with the same dog regardless of whether a qualifying score is earned or an equivalent title is received from a national dog association..
¹ Qualification at the "County Level" means earning a qualifying score at County Fair or, if allowed by the County, earning a qualifying score at a 4-H Fun Match.			
* Exhibitors qualifying in a Rally class at County Level regardless if they attend State 4-H Dog Trials, are strongly recommended to move to the next appropriate class the following year.			
* *If a member earns an equivalent title (AKC, UKC, etc.) <u>MORE than 4 months</u> prior to State 4-H Dog Trials, they are disqualified from competing in that same level at State Fair. They may still compete at the level if the title is received <u>LESS than 4 months</u> prior to State Fair.			
*** Counties are encouraged to follow the 4-H State Dog Trails rules as closely as possible. Please note that some counties may have differences and it is important that exhibitors learn both their county and state rules to ensure success in qualifying for 4-H State Dog Trail Fair. Counties have the discretion for class placement. However, State 4-H Dog Trials rules may prohibit eligibility for 4-H State Dog Trial entry.
