



2024 4-H EXHIBIT CHECK-IN PROCESS

Enter the State Fairgrounds through Beulah Gate on Beulah Street – Gate 9 (main entrance to the fairgrounds). Put 2001 W Summit Ave, Pueblo, or Colorado State University Dining Hall into your GPS to get to the correct gate. *Superintendents may check in their county projects on Monday, August 12, from 2:00 – 5:00pm. All other counties should plan to arrive at the time you signed up for in 4-H Online on Tuesday, August 13. (Project check in is only one day this year. Judging starts on Wednesday.)* **If you bring projects early, we may not be able to accept them until your designated time.** Make sure you have labeled all exhibits and record books based on the FairEntry training provided by Joy Bauder. Both the project and the record book should have a barcoded label on them. Review the recording of the training if necessary to ensure accuracy of labeling.

Only the people whose names were provided in the sign-up will be allowed to bring exhibits to state fair, unless communicated to the State 4-H Office by August 9. **If you have members meeting you in Pueblo to drop off their exhibits, the 4-H specialist, staff, or volunteer should coordinate with the family to meet them at the gate.** Place the exhibit on the correct table according to the class numbers and age division, except for Foods & Nutrition, Food Preservation, Cake Decorating, Artistic Clothing and Clothing Construction. The volunteers will place the items on the tables for those projects. Before you leave the check-in areas, verify that you have all the correct items for each project and that they are all together, so no part of the exhibit gets lost.

Tips and tricks: To make drop off easier, we recommend grouping your record books into boxes based on drop off location prior to packing your vehicle. Bring a printed list of all your exhibits, so you can cross them off as you drop them in the correct locations. Don't forget a cart!
