**Exhibit:** Completed Leathercraft e-Record and completed article or articles that meet unit requirements. **Note:** Any dyeing, color shading, antique/stain, and finishing techniques may be used in units 4-9. All pictures meant to be hung need to be complete with hardware to hang for display, whether framed or not. Any lacing, hand sewing and/or machine sewing may be used in units 4-9.

Unit 4—Advanced Leather Carving: One completed article, matching set, or picture/wall hanging using one of the following techniques: <u>advanced traditional</u> <u>carving</u>, figure carving, pictorial carving, <u>decorative swivel knife carving</u>, <u>embossing</u> or <u>filigree work</u>. (Note: All pictures meant to be hung need to be complete with hardware to hang for display, whether framed or not.) Any lacing, hand sewing, and/or machine sewing may be used in Unit 4, though they are not required. **Unit 5—Advanced Stamping:** One completed article, matching set, or picture/wall hanging using an advanced stamping design. Minimal carving is allowed for effect (i.e., use swivel knife to carve border, letters, brands, etc.). **Judges may use the back of the form for more comments.** 

Judging Element 1: 4-H e-Record: Complete means everything has been filled out. Not complete means there is something missing and needs a comment as to what is missing or why it is not complete. Project will be evaluated on the quality of information completed in e-record (25 %) and quality of exhibit (75 %).
