



Colorado 4-H Shooting Sports State Championships

.22 Rifle

Range Volunteers

Each .22 rifle range needs 2-3 Range Safety Officers and 1 main Line Officer per relay *All individuals working on the range must have a current certification in the Rifle Discipline

Line Officer

- Will be in charge of tracking the time, calling the official range commands
 - Printed instructions and range commands are in each range box
- Utilizing list provided, ensure that all members are in the correct lanes
- Before sight in period begins, one range safety officer needs to go down range to the targets and call the name that's on each target and verify with the participant that it's their target
- After sight in period is over, line officer will stay back with eyes on participants and guns to ensure safety while other range officers go down range and mark any shots not in the sight in area (middle section of prone target).
- After range officers are back, line officer will call all youth back to line and once ready will start the 40-minute record shot period.
- At the end of the 40- minute record shot period (or upon all youth completing their record shots) will call cease fire, instruct youth to pack up firearms first and move them off the range, then remove the remainder of the equipment

Range Safety Officer

- Range Safety Officers should be spread out throughout the range and keep an eye on 3-5 kids each.
- Watch for any safety concerns/issues and address them appropriately either by talking to the participant or calling a cease fire if needed.
 - This includes ensuring that the youth are far enough forward on the firing line
- Assist youth if they are having issues
 - Examples include stuck casings, misfires, crossfires, etc.
- Mark sighter shots on targets after sight-in period
- Assist the Line Officer with whatever they need.

*Any person who volunteers a minimum of 2 relays as a Line Officer or Range Safety Officer will receive a lunch ticket.

*All volunteers must have proper eye and ear protection and closed-toed shoes.

*You may volunteer on ranges that have youth from your county on it, just no coaching them.

*If you can volunteer, please see Margaret Marr at the check-in table in the score shack to let her know that you are willing and able, or if you hear a call for volunteers, please show up to that range.

It takes a minimum of 15 volunteers each relay, so please volunteer your time!
