Exhibit: Completed Cake Decorating e-Record. A detailed notebook describing your project including your goals, plans, accomplishments, and your evaluation of your results. If an item was made as a part of your project, a sample may be displayed as further evidence of the quality of your project. Displays must not require over 2' x 2' exhibit area or consist of more than three items. Judges may use the back of the form for more comments.

Judging Element 1: 4-H e-Record: Complete means that everything has been filled out. Not complete means that there is something missing and needs a comment as to what is missing or why it is not complete. Project will be evaluated on the quality of information completed in e-record (25 percent) and quality of exhibit (75 percent).
