If a pattern was used, secure a copy of the pattern to the e-Record. One piece or a set of up to three coordinated pieces illustrating what was learned. The skills demonstrated in the exhibit can utilize Stockinette and/or Garter stitch and must include at least one of the following: lace work; cable work; color work. Ribbing is optional. Judges may use the back of the form for more comments.

**Judging Element 1:** 4-H e-Record: Complete means that everything has been filled out. Not complete means that there is something missing and needs a comment as to what is missing or why it is not complete. Project will be evaluated on the quality of information completed in e-record (25 percent) and quality of exhibit (75 percent).
