Exhibit: Completed Leathercraft e-Record, 3 samples and one completed leather article using tools learned in Unit 2.

Unit 2—Beginning Leather Carving: Exhibit items are on a board 12" x 18" x 1/8" or 1/4" (preferably pegboard) to which items are attached by lacing or thread.

1. **Exhibit three samples and one article.** Any floral pattern can be used as long as it uses all the required tools within the design.

Sample 1: Use of swivel knife and camouflage tool.

Sample 2: Use of swivel knife, camouflage tool, pear shader, beveler and veiner.

Sample 3: Use of swivel knife, camouflage tool, pear shader, beveler and veiner, seeder, backrrounder, and decorative cuts.

Note: The labels should reflect the tools used for each sample.

2. **One completed article** using tools and skills studied in Unit 2 **with double loop lacing.** Only a **clear** leather finish can be used to complete the article and sample 3 (a clear finish is optional for samples 1 and 2, so one could complete samples being exhibited later and then apply a finish).

Not Permitted: Pictorial carving or figure carving (realistic animal and human figures), color shading or dyeing, or machine stitching.

Judges may use the back of the form for more comments.

Judging Element 1: 4-H e-Record: Complete means everything has been filled out. Not complete means there is something missing and needs a comment as to what is missing or why it is not complete. Project will be evaluated on the quality of information completed in e-record (25 %) and quality of exhibit (75 %).
